For the callers, there was three days of attending seminars and conference sessions to discuss and learn the latest developments, worldwide, in our activity. Jerry Jestin and Nasser Shukayr are Callerlab accredited coaches from America who gave us insights into calling and "Modern Square Dancing" generally. Steve Turner and Brian Hotchkies added an Australian component to the sessions: we were pleased to be able to get the benefit of their experience as well. It was great to see several new young Callers learning to call. These came from Victoria where some of the established Callers are mentoring them.

David was inspired by speakers at the Callers' conference to try some different methods of teaching and to use different choreography. We know that he will use what he learned to enhance Club nights in the future.

The conference leaders gave their impressions of the future of square dancing. We discussed where we are heading and what can be done to reverse the pattern of diminishing numbers. The WA Callers seem to be onto a good program to introduce new dancers to Square Dancing. They are conducting continuous learning groups for new dancers: these dancers will probably join existing Clubs when they are looking for the full mainstream program. Maybe we could use a similar program in Queensland. We were encouraged to think "Outside the Box" when it come to teaching, recruiting new dancers and callers, as well as thinking about the type of music we use.

Several dancers are still travelling and plan to visit Clubs in other States on their way home. It is nice to know that as dancers we can call in to Clubs in towns where we visit and be welcomed with open arms.

Rambling Eights has our Biannual BBQ/Meeting planned for 20th June. We will be planning for our Christmas in July party, our end of the year outing, how we can participate in Qld. Society events, next year's camp and generally plot a course for 2013.

Our thoughts and best wishes go to our dancing friends who have been sick recently. We hope you recover to full health again soon and that we meet on the dance floor.
